

GDPR – Key definitions

Data Controller

A controller determines the purposes and means of processing personal data. "the controller shall be responsible for, and be able to demonstrate, compliance with the principles."

Data Processor

A processor is responsible for processing personal data on behalf of a controller

Personal Data

Any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified by reference to an identifier.

Special categories of personal data including;

Race and ethnicity

Sensitive Personal Data

- Political, religious, or philosophical beliefs
- Health information
- Sexual orientation
- Genetic and biometric data (used for identification)

Pseudonymisation

The use of identifiers such as reference numbers to replace direct personal data

Privacy Impact Assessments (PIAs), Data Protection Impact Assessments (DPIAs)

A tool designed identify the most effective way to comply with data protection obligations. Including;

- A description of the processing operations
- Purposes,
- Necessity,
- Proportionality,
- Level of risk to individuals,
- Risk control.

Profiling

Automated processing of personal data for evaluation analysis or prediction
